Aims:

Presentation of the course:

The class will read the text and create an agreed translation through contributions from participants. There will be a full discussion of the author's style and, where appropriate, an analysis of the language used.

2. Show an improved knowledge of Latin grammar and vocabulary
3. Translate orally from Latin into English more effectively
4. Demonstrate an enhanced appreciation of literary style
5. Show a greater understanding of the context within which the texts were written
